Alfred R. (Al) Bennett is a nationally recognized authority in judicial and correction facilities (both adult and juvenile). His wide-ranging Correctional experience includes correctional officer and teacher at the Pendleton DOC facility, superintendent at DOC facilities in Rockville and Plainfield, Deputy Commissioner with the State Department of Corrections, and service on various commissions and committees relating to justice system issues.

Al developed the Juvenile Facility Planning Guide for the American Correctional Association originally published in 1993. The guide, now in its Third Addition, is the standard used by practitioners and architects for the development of Juvenile Facilities.

Over the years Al has prepared numerous multi-million dollar construction and operational budgets. He worked effectively with persons of varying backgrounds and systematically built security programs, coordinating the efforts of administrators, accountants, architects and engineers in the planning and construction of many new facilities and physical improvements. He has also helped implement strategies for architectural and engineering designs since 1983. He has developed programs for prisons, detention centers, county jails, juvenile facilities and other criminal justice facilities.
